


CMP Amendment 29 AM Examples

18 October 2016

Current Allocations (from CMP 26, *if approved*):

- Recreational Sector: 68% of stock ACL
 - Will equal 6.263 mp after CMP 26 implementation
- Commercial Sector: 32% of stock ACL
 - Will equal 2.947 mp after CMP 26 implementation

Recent recreational landings trends, w/ FLEC:



How the AM will work with allocation sharing:

- Assumptions:
- Uses CMP 26 ACLs, which equal 9.21 mp for 2016/17
- Alternative 2, option 2b: 10% transfer
 - Rec ACL = 5.342 mp; Comm ACL = 3.868 mp
- Alternative 2, Option 2g: 75% recreational min landings threshold
 - Equals 4.006 mp

Example 1 -

- Recreational landings = 6 mp, exceeds threshold (4.006 mp) *and* sector ACL (5.342 mp), transfer is cancelled for next year
- Current AM – **Season closed early because ACL was exceeded**
- Proposed AMs – next year season based on original ACL of 6.263 mp
- **Because the previous year's landings were less than the ACL for the following year, the next fishing year would not need to be shortened**

Example 2 -

- Recreational landings = 6.5 mp, exceeds threshold (4.006 mp) *and* sector ACL (5.342 mp), transfer is cancelled for next year
- Current AM – Season closed early because ACL was exceeded
- Proposed AMs – next year season based on original ACL of 6.263 mp
- Fishing in the following fishing year would be shortened based on when the recreational ACL of 6.263 mp would be projected to be met

Example 3 -

- Recreational landings = 4.5 mp, exceeds threshold (4.006 mp) *but not the sector ACL* (5.342 mp), transfer is cancelled for next year
- Current AM – No action
- Proposed AMs – next year season based on original ACL of 6.263 mp
- Because the previous year's landings were less than the ACL for the following year, the next fishing year would not need to be shortened
