Biological Review of the Texas Closure

REEF FISH

Discussion of Recent Court Rulings

<u>Motion</u>: That staff return to the June Council meeting with a suite of recommendations with options to allow discussions to move forward with reallocation of red snapper.

<u>Substitute Motion</u>: To put discussion of red snapper allocation on the agenda for the June Council meeting.

Substitute Motion carried 13 to 3.

Projections for 2017 Federal Recreational Fishing Season and Discussion of State Seasons

<u>Motion</u>: To develop an amendment that would allow Louisiana to manage the harvest of its historical percentage of the Gulf-wide recreational red snapper landings during the calendar years of 2019, 2020, and 2021 out to 200 nm. Historical landings refers to landings as determined through the preferred alternatives outlined and adopted by the Council for allocations in Amendment 40 but also including the years 2014 and 2015.

Motion carried 11 to 5.

<u>Motion</u>: To direct staff to start a framework action to modify the red snapper ACT for the federal for-hire component and the private recreational component.

Motion carried 14 to 0.

Final Action – Amendment 36A – Modifications to Commercial IFQ Programs

Motion: In Amendment 36A, that Action 4 be moved to considered but rejected.

2.4 Action 4 – Dealer Notification Requirement for Beginning to Offload IFQ Species

Preferred Alternative 1: No Action. Do not require IFQ dealers to provide notification to NMFS specifying when a vessel will offload IFQ species.

Alternative 2: Require IFQ dealers to notify NMFS when a vessel will offload IFQ species. The notification must be made at least 1 hour, and no more than 24 hours, before offloading begins.

Alternative 3: Require IFQ dealers to notify NMFS when a vessel will offload IFQ species. The notification must be made at least 3 hours, and no more than 24 hours, before offloading begins.

Motion: To move Action 2.2 in Amendment 36A to Amendment 36B.

2.2.2 Action 2.2 – Method of Redistributing Shares from Non-activated Accounts

Alternative 1: No Action. Do not redistribute the red snapper and grouper-tilefish shares that were returned to NMFS.

Preferred Alternative 2: Redistribute the shares from each share category equally among all shareholders of that share category.

Alternative 3: Redistribute the shares from each share category according to the proportion of shares held by shareholders of that share category at the time the shares are redistributed by NMFS.

Alternative 4: Redistribute the shares equally from each share category to the allocation-only account holders with a commercial reef fish permit and landings in 2015 for that share category, but not related to other accounts with shares.

Motion carried 13 to 2.

Motion: To approve Reef Fish Amendment 36A and that it be forwarded to the Secretary of Commerce for review and implementation, and deem the codified text as necessary and appropriate, giving staff editorial license to make the necessary changes in the document. The Council Chair is given the authority to deem any changes to the codified text as necessary and appropriate.

Option 2a: Remove the Gulf ACT as a management target.

Motion: In Action 2, to make Alternative 2, Option 2b the Preferred Alternative.

Alternative 2: Retain mutton snapper within the aggregate 10-snapper recreational bag limit in the Gulf, but specify a bag limit for mutton snapper within the aggregate bag limit year round.

Option 2b: 5 fish/person/day

Motion carried with no opposition.

Motion: In Action 3, to make Alternative 2 the Preferred Alternative.

Alternative 2: Increase the minimum size limit for commercial and recreational mutton snapper in the Gulf to 18 inches TL.

Motion: In Action 4, to make Alternative 2 the Preferred Alternative.

Alternative 2: Increase the commercial minimum size limit for gag in the Gulf to 24 inches TL.

Motion carried with no opposition.

<u>Motion</u>: To recommend that the Council approve Framework Action Mutton Snapper ACL and Management Measures and Gag Commercial Size Limit and that it be forwarded to the Council for final action and sent to the Secretary of Commerce for review and implementation, and deem the codified text as necessary and appropriate, giving staff editorial license to make the necessary changes in the document. The Council Chair is given the authority to deem any changes to the codified text as necessary and appropriate.

Draft Amendment 47 – Modify Vermilion Snapper ACLs and MSY Proxy

Motion: In Action 1, to make Alternative 2 the Preferred Alternative.

Alternative 2: The proxy for vermilion snapper MSY is the yield when fishing at F30% SPR.

Motion carried with no opposition.

Motion: In Action 1, to add a new Alternative 3.

Alternative 3: The proxy for vermilion snapper MSY is the yield when fishing at F26% SPR.

Motion carried with no opposition.

Motion: In Action 2, to make Alternative 3 the Preferred Alternative.

Alternative 3: The ACL for vermilion snapper for the years 2017 through 2021 will be 3.11 mp ww (constant catch average of the 5-year annual ACLs).

Motion: In Action 2, to remove Options a and b under Alternatives 2 & 3.

Alternative 2: The ACL for vermilion snapper for the years 2017 through 2021 will be based on the annual ABC derived from fishing at 75% of $F_{30\% SPR}$.

Option a. After 2021, the ACL will be remain at 3.03 mp ww.

Option b. After 2021, the ACL will be set at 2.98 mp ww (equilibrium ABC).

Alternative 3: The ACL for vermilion snapper for the years 2017 through 2021 will be 3.11 mp ww (constant catch average of the 5-year annual ACLs).

Option a. After 2021, the ACL will be remain at 3.11 mp ww.

Option b. After 2021, the ACL will be set at the equilibrium ABC level of 2.98 mp ww.
